

Start a Vocations Prayer Program in your Parish and/or School



How to Include the Wee Apostles and Disciples Vestments and Vessels in your Program

Do you have a vocations prayer program that involves your parish families and community? If not, how about starting one, and include these adorable high quality child-size vestments and habits to teach children about vocations to the priesthood and religious life? Children play and pray, while they learn, and the family prays together. These vestments are donated to parishes who have, or establish an **active** vocations prayer program. Here's how:

- Develop a vocations prayer program at your parish in which a crucifix or chalice is sent from home to home, week by week, with prayers for vocations to the priesthood and religious life. This will take a coordinator and a means to sign-up (ex: sign-up sheets or www.signupgenius.com) to promote when need be and keep the program active. A small vocations committee will be needed at your parish to promote the program and offer valuable ways to pray for vocations.
- 2. Check with your diocese for programs available or recommendations. The following resources are very helpful and full of information for parishes: *thinkpriest.org*, *vianneyvocations.com*, and *vocationministry.com*.
- 3. Once your program is established, request the Wee Apostles and Disciples child-size vestments that travel with your prayer program from home to home, week to week, for the families that want this option. The vestments will be *donated* to your parish.
- 4. Some families without children will choose to pray without the wee vestments while those with children, even grandchildren, will cherish them as an educational aid to promote vocations. Make it optional. The power of prayer seeds and stirs vocations.
- 5. If the vestments can actively be used as an educational tool in other ways at your parish and/or school, that is a plus!
- 6. An educational booklet and prayer cards accompany the vestments and vessels, along with the crucifix or chalice.
- 7. Keep your sign-up methods active as there should be a new family or household praying each week. (If your parish is small, try a monthly sign-up.)
- 8. Contact Wcc Apostles and Disciples for a phone conversation about your parish's vocations program and to order the "vestments and vessels" play kits. (Some child-size Mass kits may be available for donation to parishes from Wee Apostles also: chalice, ciborium, wee altar linens, cruets, etc.)
